Hello Mick Thomas,

I was at the hearing in Fruitland last week but had to leave before I could verbally present my objection to the oil and gas industry's assumption that they have such power that they could compromise the lifestyle of an agricultural community by extracting their product from our land-held mineral rights against our wishes. Those of us who refused their \$100 for our property mineral rights did so in order to protect our homes and our lifestyles, not to mention the community infrastructure and water table.

I was astonished when Mr. Christian, the lawyer, used the term 'the tyranny of the minority' when his clients are doing just that by the tyranny of the majority. As he indicated at the hearing, the motive for drilling is based on money, and I would add, without humane considerations for the community. Where money is the leading objective, there needs to be some restrictions against runaway greed, which I don't believe the industry has at this point.
