IDL and OGCC,

Our family lives, and owns property, and pays taxes in Payette County. We live two miles from the Barlow 2-14 well site. We know that we are impacted by what happens at the Barlow well site and any other drilling or structure site in our county. We oppose the drilling of a new well on or near the Barlow 2-14 site. We were told that one well shall be allowed per spacing unit. We do not believe it is legal to sneak another well in that same spacing unit. You are using an old integration order from 2016. Why do you not have to go through another integration application process? We demand that a new application is required before SROG can move forward with this process.

Don't let SROG cut corners when there is so much at stake here. Our main concerns are:

1) We fear that the existing Barlow Well is too close to the Payette River, and it is also in a flood plane. That alone is already putting us at risk. It absolutely doesn't sound safe to add another well in that area. The drilling process passes through our water tables with the possibility of contaminating our drinking water supply. Clean water is our life source.

2) Our other big concern is our property values. It is unknown, but we can assume, what could happen to our property values. As more gas extraction infrastructure is added in our community and implemented our risk increases, and our landscape becomes dotted with more eyesores. We have been told that if there is an accident or contamination on or near our property, there is a chance our insurance companies could deny our claims, because who is really stupid enough to live right next to a well, pipeline, flaming tower anyway, right? Not us. We did not ask for this, we are not blind to what SROG is trying to do in our community, and we are not going to be silent. We were here first, and we want our rights to be upheld.

These are our concerns. We live in this community and we are directly affected by what this out-of-state company is trying to do in OUR community. They are trying to extract our resources, and don't care if we or our personal property is damaged.
