At the end of the hearing today, I wanted to make a comment. The Hearing Officer asked for comments, but I must have been on mute. I made several attempts to get your attention, but did not succeed. You then closed the hearing.

If I may I would like to state that I am Judy Irene Shaver and live in section 14 at 2410 NE 16th Street in Fruitland. I own just over 48 acres. I had opportunity to read ALL legal papers since the start of this process. I attended as many of the hearing that have been held in both Fruitland and Payette. I understood the paperwork. (I also read legal notices in the newspaper!) I understood from the beginning that there was a possibility of more than one well that they wanted to drill. I asked questions. I talked to workers, owners, and people that did business with them. I was outside the area that they were required to test our wells, but they willingly did, so I could have a baseline point for my well. I have livestock. They cooperated and worked to make sure that they did not interfere with my operations. They improved my fences and roads, and paid for grass seed to cover the ground they had disturbed. I asked questions while they were drilling and while they were testing the well. When I saw things I questioned I then asked more questions. They ALWAYS were willing to inform me and teach me.

I live next to the well and the Payette River. They listened to me about how the river acts during flood stage. Even in the 1997 flood there were "islands" in my bottom land. We have been able to access the bottom even in high water. Their well site is also built up to protect it. Nathan has the ability to turn everything off in an emergency. I asked!

The well started production near the end of December 2020. I just received a very nice royalty check in the mail!

I am very pleased with Snake River Oil and Gas.
