Enclosed please find amended Sundry notices for the Kauffman#1-9 LT and Kauffman #1-9 UT wells. In the original and corrected submission for the wells, the date and well information was inadvertently switched. After we were notified of this discrepancy, we reviewed all of the information. Attached is the final amended sundry notices for the Kauffman #1-9 LT and UT well. The *Kauffman #1-9 UT* was turned on for production on August 5, 2015. Flow testing of the *Kauffman #1-9 LT* began on March 7, 2015, and due to a paraffin build-up, we had to stop flow testing. After working to mitigate the paraffin, we notified IDL on September 17, 2015 that we intended to resume the flow testing for the remainder of the allowed days. We then resumed the flow testing on October 18, 2015 and ended the flow testing on November 5, 2015. After completion of the flow test, the well was shut in and formal production for this well did not begin until February 13, 2016. The final amended Sundry notices reflect the correct days and correspond to our production records.

During the review, discussion was held as to the process used internally to gather data from the various departments in order to report the required information. The gathering appeared to be disjointed and was not conducive to receiving accurate data. We have now amended this process, and feel that it will be more effective in the future for accurate and timely reporting of when the wells begin production. We appreciate your patience with us as we work to alleviate glitches in the system and continue to improve on our process.
