We are nearby neighbors to the Barlow property that is the site of the #1-14 and the potential site of #2-14 wells and were hopeful that justice and reason finally prevailed when we heard that well #1-14 was being abandoned. Instead we are now surprised and angered that instead of the first well being closed another well is proposed for the site.
