We are writing in response to the letter and materials received by certified mail on October 5, 2020 informing us of Snake River Oil & Gas's appeal of the denial of their application to drill Barlow #2-14.

Based on the information initially presented during the application, we continue to agree and side with the decision to deny said application. In reviewing the papers and arguments presented by Snake River Oil & Gas and their attorneys Smith +Malek, we note that no new factual information was provided other than taking exception to the original decision. Consistent with the seismic amplitude map and other related information, it is reasonable that the section 14 does in fact extend beyond the geological limits of the Sand B target resulting in unreasonable impacts.

As citizens of Idaho we are wholeheartedly invested in the preservation of the natural beauty and resources of our fine state.
