Thank you for hearing the residents of Payette County in your recent hearing in Fruitland, Idaho. We live on NE 16th Street in Fruitland, directly West of the Barlow wells and East of the newly proposed well across from WoodGrain. We have been forced to listen to the drilling process of the Barlow wells which went on for weeks and finally the flare of each of the three wells.

I am writing in opposition to the new well which is next to a residential area, across from WoodGrain and next to Dickinsons onion and pepper processing plant. We also have Mesa Sports Complex, which is the area used for all recreational activities by our youth. March through November the park is full of soccer, softball, baseball, flag football and contact football. It is also used by adult teams. What will the players be breathing in during practices and games?

How will our water be affected, the minimal bonds won't help all the residents on wells and without water what will we do? The drilling should take place miles away from residential areas. We were told Snake River couldn't do directional drilling because of the geology, funny but the proposed well is only 1/2 mile from the multi-directionally drilled Barlow wells.

Please, help us keep our residential areas, our children and our homes from harm.
